- **Fully accredited graduate degree conferred by the CGSC at no cost to CGSOC students**
- **Mandatory for US military (can opt out if in another graduate or doctoral degree program while attending CGSOC)**
- **Optional for IMS and Interagency (must Opt In to the degree program and provide official transcript with English translation for a Bachelor's or higher degree)**
- **Must complete CGSOC with a 'B' grade or higher in all Transcript Reportable Items (TRI), i.e. never go on academic probation**
- **Completion of the MOS degree upon graduation terminates eligibility for US Military to receive Tuition Assistance for a graduate degree**

- **Fully accredited graduate degree conferred by the CGSC at no cost to students**
- **Optional for all CGSOC students**
- **Must attend thesis preparation classes throughout the CGSOC; fulfills half of the electives requirements for CGSOC graduation**
- **Must complete and defend a publishable thesis of 60-125 pages length**
- **Must have a Bachelor's degree or higher**
- **Must complete CGSOC with a 'B' grade or higher in all Transcript Reportable Items (TRI)**
- **Cannot receive both the MOS and the MMAS degree**

- **Students can enroll in civilian graduate degree or certificate programs rather than completing the MOS and MMAS programs**
- **Must Opt Out of MOS degree program (US Military) and provide evidence of enrollment in the civilian degree program**
- **Any regionally accredited graduate or doctoral degree program is acceptable**
- **Program is at student expense**
- **Central Michigan University, Kansas State University, and University of Kansas offer degree and certificate programs at Fort Leavenworth**
- **Cannot transfer more than 6 hours of credit from CGSOC to another graduate degree program and remain eligible for the MOS degree**

OPTION 1



In-person language educational opportunity.
Faculty provided by the University of Kansas.

- Beginner course
 - Not eligible if proficient in the language, received college credit for the language, or have a DLPT score
- After hours at Fort Leavenworth in CGSC classrooms
- Credit toward CGSOC elective requirements (Up to three electives)
- Offered in the fall semester, optional follow-on classes in the spring
- Multiple languages offered
 - For AY24 - Korean, Russian, Spanish, Chinese, Arabic, French, German, Italian, Japanese
- SOF – KU offers several intermediate classes for SOF students
 - See CGSC SOF Element for details.
- Priority to US students
- Requires dual enrollment at KU -> No out-of-pocket expenses
- Registration period - early August

OPTION 2

Online, self-paced language educational opportunity.
Program hosted by Defense Language Institute.



- Beginner course
 - Not eligible if proficient in the language, received college credit for the language, or have a DLPT score
- Self-paced, online language courses through Defense Language Institute
 - Must use same computer for entire course
- 50 languages
- Credit towards one CGSOC elective requirement
 - May complete more than one Headstart course, but will only receive credit for one elective
- Self enroll on Bb, then access the on-line training through DLI website
- Advisable to begin course during fall semester (Common Core)
 - Course must be complete prior to the start of Electives Term 1

Deeper understanding of the art of warfighting through reading, dialogue and engagement with sixty experts


A dozen *competitively selected* Scholars led by a CGSC Chair, together for seven months, one hundred graduate seminars

- Conducted In lieu of AOC and electives
- US Students Only; TS /SCI clearance required
- Select a topic you are interested in
- Maintain GPA of 3.7 and pass X100
- IA Scholars form staff group 21A at start of AOC and done ILO electives (Nov – Jun)
- Must demonstrate teamwork, selflessness, and intellectual commitment
- Scholars must produce a publishable thesis

Officers attending the CGSOC can earn Skill Identifiers (SI) and Personnel Development Skill Identifiers (PDSI). Requirements for SIs and PDSIs are generally met through completion of selected elective courses. SIs and PDSIs are recorded in officers' personnel records.

Officers can also enhance their professional development through the completion of Certificate programs. While generally not recorded in officers' personnel records, certificates attest to the completion of a series of elective courses focused on a particular area of study, such as a geographical region of the world.




Overview

The Major General James M. Wright Master Sustainer Award (open to all student officers), previously known as the Master Logistician Award, honors the pivotal role of logistics in military endeavors. Originating in 1982/83 as the Master Logistician Program at the Command and General Staff College (CGSC), it has evolved to encompass a wider spectrum of sustainment operations. The award spotlights students who excel in crafting and executing logistical plans crucial to mission success.

The program unfolds in three phases:

1. Phase I: Online exam to assess knowledge across ten sustainment areas, Approximately the top 12% of participants advance.
2. Phase II: Selected students face an hour-long oral board session, fielding questions from CGSC faculty on sustainment topics.
3. Phase III: Finalists prepare a detailed concept of sustainment—a logistical support plan for a division level scenario, presenting and defending it before a panel of experts.

What does the Master Tactician Competition entail?

Phase I: Knowledge Assessment

- 2 Hour ~250 question exam.
- Evaluates the student's knowledge of:

 - Battalion, brigade, and division operations.
 - OPFOR tactics.
 - Army operations process and MDMP.
- Competitors receive exam trends in instructor-led AAR.

Phase II: Tactical Decision Game Assessment

- Three multi-echelon Tactical Decision Games (TDG) in a challenging, time-constrained environment.
- Evaluates competitors' application of the art and science of tactics under stress.
- Competitors receive TDG trends in instructor-led AAR.

Phase III: Planning, Execution & Command and Control Assessment

- Produce an individually-developed OPORD based on a provided scenario and present plan to a faculty panel.
- Evaluates competitors' ability to:
 - Plan and Execute BN/BCT operations
 - Communicate in writing and speaking
 - Make decisions and react to changes in the situation






Advanced Military Studies Program

The School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS) was founded in June 1983 to create a second year of study at Fort Leavenworth for selected CGSOC graduates to increase the competence of these officers, and then “leaven” that competence across the force. That course is today’s Advanced Military Studies Program (AMSP), described below.

SAMS Mission

The School of Advanced Military Studies educates select Armed Forces, Interagency and Allied members to become critical and creative thinkers, agile and adaptive leaders and skilled practitioners of doctrine and operational art, and in order to enable *senior leaders* to drive the *operations process* to achieve favorable strategic, operational and tactical outcomes.




Program Selection

All AMSP applicants are volunteers who must submit an application that indicates their military experience, civilian educational background, and future goals.

Applicants take an entrance exam that assesses the applicant’s understanding of military doctrine, basic military history, current geopolitical events, and geography. This exam also includes an essay question to assess the applicant’s reasoning, argumentation, and writing abilities.

Following completion of the exam, applicants will conduct an interview with a SAMS faculty member. The results of the exam, interview, supervisor input, and items applicants submit are compiled into a file for use by a locally-convened selection board. This board reviews the files and produces an Order of Merit List (OML) for review by the Commanding General for the Combined Arms Center and subsequent approval and sourcing by DA, Human Resources Command (HRC).
