




What is ASLSP

The ASLSP Experience

Seminar-Based Education

- Small seminars (~16 students)
- High-engagement discussions and faculty mentorship
- Daily reading, writing, and critical analysis

Field Studies

- Approximately seven weeks of travel
- Visits to U.S. and Allied commands in CONUS, Europe, and Asia
- Direct engagement with senior military and civilian leaders
- Exposure to joint, interagency, multinational, and nongovernmental perspectives



Academic Focus Areas

- Strategic theory and history
- Regional and global security studies
- Joint and all-domain warfighting
- Strategic leadership
- Research, writing, and professional scholarship

Capstone Requirements

- Individual strategic research paper suitable for publication
- Integrated planning exercise addressing real-world strategic problems
- Comprehensive oral examination at the end of the academic year

How Selection Works

- Senior U.S. Army officers, Joint service officers, International military officers, Interagency professional are eligible to apply
- Drawn from the Senior Service College list
- SAMS reviews and nominates top candidates
- Final selection approved through Army and Joint processes
- Sister services, international, and interagency selections coordinated separately
- Refer to current MILPER for eligibility and timeline



After ASLSP

- Earn a Master of Arts in Strategic Studies (MASS)
- JPME II and MEL I completion
- 6S Officer Additional Skill Identifier
- Opportunity to serve as a SAMS faculty member

Graduate Outcomes

- Design effective strategic concepts and communicate persuasively
- Appraise the role of strategic leadership in the JIIM environment
- Determine the military dimensions of a challenge using theory, history, and doctrine of joint warfighting across the spectrum of cooperation, competition, and conflict
- Assess factors impacting strategic competition and their effects on global operating environments
- Develop strategies and plans that support US, ally, and partner interest across the spectrum of conflict
- Evaluate the application of military power in globally integrated all-domain operations
